POWELL COUNTY 4-H POLICY

Official 4-H Year – October 1 – September 30

Youth who are 5 yrs. old on Oct. 1 may join as a Cloverbud. Age 8 on Oct. 1 may join as a regular member

Communications: **Every member** must give a presentation or demonstration at the club-level each year.

Shooting Sports: Member must be 9 years of age on Oct.1 of the current 4-H year to enroll in all

disciplines.

Beef & Dairy: Member must be **10 yrs. of age on Oct 1** or a 2nd year member to enroll in all market and

breeding beef, and dairy projects. Must sign up for market beef by 12/1 and hogs &

sheep by 5/1.

Enrollment Forms: Entry into ZSuite for returning members must be completed by October 31. Returning

leaders must enroll by Oct 15. New leaders and new members can enroll up to December

1. Market animals may not be weighed-in without a current enrollment in ZSuite.

Record Books: Completed Record books must be turned into the organizational leader by close of

business on the **last Friday in September.** They will be reviewed during the first week of October. Fair premiums and enrollment forms will not be issued prior to a completed record book. A member failing to turn in a **completed** record book to the organizational

leader will not be able to participate in the incomplete project for a period of one year.

County Events: Refer to Powell County 4-H County Event Policy.

Quality Assurance: Quality assurance is required for all animal projects for all 4-Hers each year. All 4-Hers

are required to attend a quality assurance training and have proof of completion submitted to your organizational leader by July 1. If you do not attend the required QA you will not

be allowed to bring animal projects to fair.

Horse Projects: It is recommended that riders wear an ASTM Certified/SEI approved safety helmet

whenever mounted on a horse or in a cart. If a member chooses not to wear a helmet, a waiver form must be signed by the member and parent/guardian and submitted with the Fair Entry form. If a member is in need of a helmet, contact the Powell County 4-H

Council.
